SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1. Rules

- 1.1 The race will be governed by the rules defined in the racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 If there is conflict between the Notice of Race (NoR) and the Sailing Instructions the Sailing Instructions shall take precedence. This changes RRS 63.7.
- 1.3 A Special Regulations Checklist must be completed online before a yacht may start.

2. Notice to Competitors

2.1 The Official Notice Board (ONB) is the Group's website (<u>www.jog.org.uk</u>).

3. Changes to Sailing instructions

3.1 Any changes to the sailing instructions will, if possible, be posted on the website by 1700hrs before the race start, promulgated in the JOG WhatsApp Group and announced by VHF radio.

4. Signals made ashore

4.1 Limited signals made ashore will be displayed at the flagstaff behind the race officer's box.

5. Class Flags

5.1 Each yacht shall carry her class numeral pennant on her backstay as shown on the list of entries.

6. The Course

6.1 If the **Green Flag** is displayed

Start Line (east to west)

Bridge Buoy (leave to starboard)

DZB Range Buoy (approx. pstn 50.32.11 N 02.05.92W, leave to starboard)

East Shambles (leave to starboard)
Finishing Line (southeast to northwest). Distance approx. 44 miles

6.2 If the **Red Flag** is displayed

The course for all classes will be announced on VHF Channel M1 (37a).

7. Areas that are Obstructions

- 7.1 Boats shall comply with Associated British Ports Notice to Marines No 9 of 2021. The Moving Prohibited Zone in the Precautionary Area shall rank as an obstruction for the purposes of RRS 19 and 20. Boats shall avoid close guarters with any commercial vessel.
- 7.2 Boats shall not pass North of Horse Sand or South of No Man's Land Forts.
- 7.3 Boats shall not anchor or kedge in the Cowes harbour fairway nor in the area between Stone Point and Gurnard Bay on Admiralty Chart 2040. Gas and water pipes, telephone and electricity cables carrying 133,000 volts lie on the sea bed.
- 7.4 Boats shall keep a good look out for ferries and commercial traffic.
- 7.5 Whilst racing, boats shall always pass to the north of the Cowes breakwater.

8. Identity Gate.

8.1 Before she starts, each yacht (subject to draft) must pass between the beach and one of the Mooring Buoys approximately on the Starting Line in an East to West direction showing her sail number and receive visual acknowledgement before starting.

9. The Start

9.1 All times are BST and races will be started as follows:


Radio announcements may also be made.

This changes RRS 26.

- 9.2 **The Starting Line** is between the Gurnard buoy and a flagstaff behind the race officers' box which is about 50m to the eastward of the New Holmwood Hotel, Egypt Point, Cowes. A JOG burgee may be flown.
- 9.3 If a bright, turquoise blue Flag is signalled, the **Alternative Starting Line** is the **transit** formed by a flagstaff behind the race officers' box and Gurnard buoy with the outer limit, not necessarily on the line, as North East Gurnard buoy. Yachts starting may pass either side of Gurnard buoy.
- 9.4 In the event of the race being postponed or abandoned, appropriate flags will be flown and announcements made by VHF radio.
- 9.5 Recalls (individual and general) will be indicated by appropriate sound signals and announced by VHF radio only. This changes Race Signals.
- 9.6 Sail numbers of individually recalled boats may be broadcast on VHF as soon as practical. Failure to hail, display or broadcast sail numbers shall not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- 9.7 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for the other races.

10. The Finish.

- 10.1 **The Finishing Line** is to be taken as a line between the POLE, grey in colour, (Signal Station, Traffic) approximately midway on Weymouth South Pier and DG Range SE Buoy, approx pstn 50 36.4N 02.26 2W, leaving the buoy to starboard and leaving the remaining two buoys (SE and NW) close to starboard.
- 10.2 Competitors are advised to stay close to the DG Range buoys in order to keep clear of the Mixen Rocks adjacent to the pier, carefully avoiding boats approaching the finish line. Please exercise great caution and ensure you are keeping a thorough look-out after finishing. See sketch of finish line, **not to be used for navigation.** Please avoid any commercial traffic and observe Harbour Rules



10.2 Leading yachts are requested to text the Race Officer when about 30 minutes from the finish. Finish declarations are mandatory. Each skipper should ensure, prior to racing, that their email address and mobile tel no are correct in the race entry in MyJog. A skipper can nominate an alternative email and mobile number. JOG will text and email a link to the online declaration form prior to the race start, using these contact details. You should input your (UK) finishing time (normally BST) along with names of the boat ahead and astern where possible. This time must be recorded accurately as it will be used for the results. Only in the event that you experience any difficulties should you text the required information to +447576 882150. The online finish declaration should be made as soon as, safely, possible.
JOG will endeavour to have a finishing team recording your time. However, this may not be

11. Protest and Requests for Redress

11.1 Boats shall notify the race committee by VHF at the end of the race that they intend to protest.

possible. In order to guarantee a placing, we will need your own recorded time.

- 11.2 Protest forms are available from the Race Officer at the finish or the JOG Secretary at secretary@jog.org.uk.
- 11.3 Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered within 120 minutes of the protesting yacht finishing.

12 Scoring

- 12.1 See Notice of Race Instruction 23.
- 12.2 Results will contribute to the Category 4 series 2021.

13. Retirements and Withdrawals

13.1 Retirements and withdrawals must be advised on VHF Channel M1 (37a) (at the start and finish) call sign JOG One. Remember that we are only allowed to operate on low power so you may not be able to hear

- our response to your transmission. Please transmit your message even if there is apparently no reply. The Race Officers should also be contacted by Mobile **07576 882150**.
- 13.2 Retiring yachts must complete their online declaration form, indicating their reason for retirement, **and** notify the Race Officers as soon as possible. Failure to "report in" may lead to an unnecessary call to the SAR Services.

14. Radio Communication

14.1 All communications at the start and finish will be on VHF Channel M1 (37a) call sign JOG One.

15. Disclaimer of Liability

- 15.1 Competitors participate in the Race entirely at their own risk. See RRS4, Decision to race. The organising authority will not accept any liability for material damage, personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
- 15.2 By taking part in any of the events covered by the Special notice of race, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that they are responsible for complying with any regulations in force from time to time in respect of COVID-19 and for complying with the COVID procedures.

16. Insurance
