SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Rules**
 - 1.1 The race will be governed by the rules defined in the racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
 - 1.2 If there is conflict between the Notice of Race (NoR) and the Sailing Instructions the Sailing Instructions shall take precedence. This changes RRS 63.7.
 - 1.3 A Special Regulations Checklist must be completed online before a yacht may start.
- 2. Notice to Competitors**
 - 2.1 The Official Notice Board (ONB) is the Group's website (www.jog.org.uk).
- 3. Changes to Sailing instructions**
 - 3.1 Any changes to the sailing instructions will be posted on the website by 1700hrs before the race start and announced by VHF radio.
- 4. Signals made ashore**
 - 4.1 Limited signals made ashore will be displayed at the flagstaff behind the race officer's box.
- 5. Class Flags**
 - 5.1 Each yacht shall carry her class numeral pennant on her backstay as shown on the list of entries.

6. The Course

- 6.1 If the **Green Flag** is displayed
Start Line (west to east)
Snowden buoy, (leave to starboard)
Between Horse Sand and No Man's Land Forts
Nab Tower (round to port)
Winner Buoy (round to port)
Between Horse Sand and No Man's Land Forts
Snowden buoy, (leave to port)
Finishing Line. Distance approx. 35 miles
- 6.2 If the **Red Flag** is displayed
The course for all classes will be announced on VHF Channel M1 (37a).

7. Areas that are Obstructions




- 7.1 Boats shall comply with Associated British Ports Notice to Mariners No 3 of 2016. The Moving Prohibited Zone in the Precautionary Area shall rank as an obstruction for the purposes of RRS 19 and 20. Boats shall avoid close quarters with any commercial vessel.
- 7.2 Boats shall not pass North of Horse Sand or South of No Man's Land Forts.
- 7.3 Boats shall not anchor or kedge in the Cowes harbour fairway nor in the area between Stone Point and Gurnard Bay on Admiralty Chart 2040. Gas and water pipes, telephone and electricity cables carrying 133,000 volts lie on the sea bed.
- 7.4 Boats shall keep a good look out for ferries and commercial traffic.
- 7.5 Whilst racing, boats shall always pass to the north of the Cowes breakwater.

8. Identity Gate.

- 8.1 Before she starts, each yacht (subject to draft) must pass between the beach and one of the Mooring Buoys approximately on the Starting Line in an East to West direction, **with all crew members wearing a lifejacket and safety harness, and receive visual acknowledgement before starting.**

9. The Start

- 9.1 Races will be started as follows:

Radio announcements may also be made.
This changes RRS 26.

- 9.2 **The Starting Line** is between the Gurnard buoy and a flagstaff behind the race officers' box which is about 50m to the eastward of the New Holmwood Hotel, Egypt Point, Cowes. A JOG burgee may be flown.
- 9.3 If a bright, turquoise blue Flag is signalled, the **Alternative Starting Line** is the **transit** formed by a flagstaff behind the race officers' box and Gurnard buoy with the outer limit, not necessarily on the line, as North East Gurnard buoy. Yachts starting may pass either side of Gurnard buoy.
- 9.4 In the event of the race being postponed or abandoned, appropriate flags will be flown and announcements made by VHF radio.
- 9.5 Recalls (individual and general) will be indicated by appropriate sound signals and announced by VHF radio only. This changes Race Signals.

- 9.6 Sail numbers of individually recalled boats **may** be broadcast on VHF as soon as practical. Failure to hail, display or broadcast sail numbers shall not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- 9.7 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for the other races.
- 10. The Finishing Line**
- 10.1 The **FINISHING LINE** is the same line as the start line, finishing East to West. A JOG burgee may be flown at the masthead. Leading yachts should call **JOG ONE, on Ch 37a 30 minutes prior to finishing line.**
- 10.2 **In order to produce faster/real time race results we need your help. Please take your finish time carefully. Mandatory declarations online need to be completed within 30 minutes of finishing. If for some reason you are unable to complete the declaration online, please text the JOG Mobile as soon as possible with yacht name, sail number, finishing time, boat ahead & boat astern (text 07576 882150). A declaration must still be lodged online as soon as possible.**
Where we have visibility of the finish line JOG will endeavour to have a finishing team recording your time, however, this is not always possible and in order to guarantee a placing we will need your own recorded time.
- 11. Protest and Requests for Redress**
- 11.1 Boats shall notify the race committee by VHF at the end of the race that they intend to protest.
- 11.2 Protest forms are available from the Race Officer at the finish or the JOG Secretary at secretary@jog.org.uk.
- 11.3 Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered within 120 minutes of the yacht finishing the race.
- 12 Scoring**
- 12.1 See Notice of Race Instruction 22.
- 12.2 Results will contribute to the Category 4 series 2020.
- 13. Retirements and Withdrawals**
- 13.1 Retirements and Withdrawals must be advised on VHF Channel M1 (37a) (at the start and finish) call sign JOG One. Remember that we are only allowed to operate on low power so you may not be able to hear our response to your transmission. Please transmit your message even if there is apparently no reply. The Race Officers should also be contacted by Mobile **07576 882150.**
- 13.2 Retiring yachts must complete their online declaration form, indicating their reason for retirement, **and** notify the Race Officers as soon as possible. Failure to “report in” may lead to an unnecessary call to the SAR Services.
- 14. Radio Communication**
- 14.1 All communications at the start and finish will be on VHF Channel M1 (37a) call sign JOG One.
- 15. Disclaimer of Liability**
- 15.1 Competitors participate in the Race entirely at their own risk. See RRS4, Decision to race. The organising authority will not accept any liability for material damage, personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
- 16. Insurance**
- 16.1 See Notice of Race Sec 26.
